Haflong Government College- A Profile

Haflong Government College has completed its 63rd year of glorious existence on the 4th of September 2023. This college was born through the vision of the illustrious sons of the soil like Late N.L. Daolagupu, backed by the unstinted support of the intelligentia of that time like Sonaram Thaosen, J.B. Hagjer, Surath Chandra Daulagupu, Hironmoy Das Barman, G.C. Langthasa, P.C. Langthasa, D. Hojai, P.K. Gorlosa, V. Hmar, Nishikanta Daulagupu, Yusuf Khan and B. Chakraborty. The dream and vision of the pioneers became a reality with the establishment of this college on the 4th of September, 1961 and thus a new chapter was added to the annals of this hilly district. Since its inception this premier institution took up cudgels to articulate the aspirations of the ethnicsocieties of the district. This college was started as a private night college with 17 students on its rollinthe Pre-university Arts classes at the Cultural Institute Hall. Later on it was shifted to its present site in 1964. Incourse of time, the college was converted to a day-college retainingthe night section as an additional shift. During later years Science and Commerce streams were added in 1969 and 1988 respectively. Moreover, under thepatronage of Dima Hasao Autonomous Council Post Graduate courses in Political Science and History were introduced from 1997 and 1999 respectively. This college can legitimately take credit for producing a large number of graduates over the years and enablingthem to occupy high positions in the society as Doctors, Engineers, Magistrates, Administrators, Teachers and political leaders.

In the very first year of its establishment, Haflong Govt. College got recognition of Gauhati University up to the Pre-university level. The college became eligible for financial assistance under Section 2(f) and was declared fit to receive central assistance {UGC grant} under Section 12(B) of UGC Act, 1956 as per approved pattern of assistance under various schemes. The college obtained recognition from Gauhati University for degree course in 1965. Pre-university science classes were started from 1969. Subsequently recognition was obtained from the Department of Higher Education, Government of Assam. Haflong Govt. College got a new dimension when it wastaken over by the Government of Assamon 5th of November, 1975. The College remained under Gauhati University till the 20th of January 1994. But, after the establishment of Assam University, itsaffiliation shifted from Gauhati University to Assam University on the 21st of January, 1994. Since 15th February 2005, the college came under the administrative control of the Dima Hasao Autonomous Council. The problem of acute shortage of teachers was solved with the appointment of contractual teachers tutors by the Autonomous Council.

History is testimony to the fact that Haflong Govt. College has consistently been at the vanguard of the most defining changes that the district has witnessed. Infrastructure facilities have been continually upgraded through the initiative of the Autonomous Council and the Government. The college has been constituted with new academic andco-curricular facilities which comprise of well furnished acousticseminar hall, fully airconditioned and equipped with an ultra HD smart LED T.V. The college Auditorium established in the year 2022 has aided the college in conducting various academic related programmes. The college is also much advantaged by the installation of a Solar Panel in deriving solar power in the entire college. Moreover the installation of rain water harvesting check the sustainability of water during lean period.

Compulsory subjects for all streams (HS Arts, Science and Commerce):

- ii) Modern Indian Language(MIL)
 - Modern Indian Languages taught in the College includes Assamese and Bengali only.
 - HMAR MIL is allowed as Institutional Private (IP) subject with due permission from ASSEB.

- (a) HS Arts students must select three elective subjects from the following list:
 - (i) Economics (ii)Political Science (iii) History/Mathematics (iv)Logic & Philosophy/Adv.Bengali or Adv. Assamese.
- (b) HS Science students must select three elective subjects from the following list:
 - (i) Physics (ii) Chemistry (iii) Mathematics and (iv) Biology
- (c) HS Commerce students must select three elective subjects from the following list: (i)Accountancy (ii)BusinessStudies (iii)Economics (iv)Commercial Arithmetic & Elements of Statistics and (v) Mathematics

HSCOURSESTRUCTURE

- i) Two years Higher Secondary Course is governed by the Rules & Regulations of Assam State School Education Board, (ASSEB). Total marks= 500.
- ii) The course comprises of two Examinations, viz (i)Firstyear and (ii)Final year.
- III)Promotion to Final year depends on the successful completion of the First year examination conducted by the college as per Assam State School Education Board, (ASSEB) guidelines.

Eligibility Criteria for Admission in Examinations:

- A candidate should have 75% of attendance both in theory and practical papers. 65% attendance may be considered only on special circumstances and on certification by the Principal of the concerned college.
- ii) A candidate shall have to qualify in the unit test securing atleast 40% marks.
- iii) A candidate shall be allowed to appear in those papers only in which he/she has secured qualifying marks in the unit test.
- iv) The college takes periodic appraisal of the students through unit test and pre final examination in HS classes as required by the ASSEB. The date of such examinations is Notified well ahead as per academic calendar of the college. A student who fails to appear in the unit test, Pre- final/ Test examination and whose performance is very poor will not be allowed to fillup their forms in the Final examination. In case of illness, sick-room will be provided.

- i) Promotion to Final year dependsonthe successfulcompletionoftheFirstyearexamination conductedbythecollegeasper Assam State School Education Board, (ASSEB) guidelines.
- ii) Astudent cantake admission intoFinal Year and isqualified for appearingintheFinal Examinationattheendofthe FinalYearclasses,ifhis/herattendanceinclass&performance inthecollege examinations areasper ASSEB norms.
- iii) First Year resultisdeclared onthebasisofgradingsystem. The grade is determined as follows: Grade-A: 60% marks and above,
 - Grade-B:45%marksandbelow60%,
 - Grade-C:Below45%
 - Grade-Dpassedwithgracemarks.
- iv) TheresultofH.S.FinalExaminationisdeterminedonthebasisofmarksobtainedintheFinal examinationonly.NocreditofFirstyearexaminationiscountedtowardtheresultoftheFinal examination.
- v) Astudentwhodoesnotappearinaparticularsubjectatthe H.S.IstyearExaminationwillnot beallowedto appear inthe same subject atthe H.S. Final Examination.

ATTENDANCERULES

- i) HSFirstYear:Studentswhodonotattendatleast75%ofthetotalnumberofclassesheldin the First year will not beallowed to appear inthe examination conducted bythe College.
- ii) HS Final Year:Students who do not attend at least 75%ofthetotal number of classes held in theFinal yearwillnotbeallowedtoappearin thePre-Final Testorfill up theformsforHS Final Examination held by ASSEB. The attendance inthe HS1st year classes willnotbetaken into account in HS Final year classes.

CANCELLATIONOFSEATS

Students failingto attend classes for 15 (fifteen) days at a stretch in the first month of commencement of classes will forfeit their seats.





B. Four years Degree Course under New Education Policy (2020) FYUG.



ASSAMUNIVERSITY, SILCHAR

Primary Guidelinesforimplementation of NEP 2020forUG courses of colleges affiliated to Assam University, Si/char.

Inorder to implement NEP 2020from thesession 2023-24forUGcoursesinaffiliatedcolleges following primary guidelines will be followed

- 1. UGcurriculum forcolleges affiliatedto Assam University shallbeafouryearUGprogramme (FYUG) aspercurriculum structureprovidedinAnnexure-1.Optionforlateralexitshallbefreefrom additional 04 credit earning. In lieu of Project / Dissertation in VIII semester, students shall have optiontotakethreeadditionalcoursesasDisciplineSpecificCoursewhichwillbeequalto 12credits intotal.However,students optingforproject/dissertationwillbegiven Honours withResearchdegree and students opting for additional three Discipline Specific courses in lieu of Project/Dissertation willbegiven Honours degree. It is decided that intheir respective prospectus each college should categorically mention this. It is also resolved that all those three papers (DSC-452,453 and 454) should be of level 500.
- 2. OfferingFourYearUnderGraduate(FYUG)programmeismandatoryforallaffiliatedcolleges. However, the colleges/ Departments shall have liberty if Honours with Research be offered or not dependingupontheirinfrastructurallimitation.IfHonourswithResearchisnotofferedinaparticular college, respective prospectus should clearly mention thisto avoid confusion amongst students.
- 3. Interdisciplinarycourses shall have 04 baskets viz; Natural Sciences (NS), Social Sciences (55), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may optfor any one from those 04 basketsineach of I, IlandIII semester. Bunching of subjects in each basket shall be asper Annexure II.
- 4. From Discipline SpecificMinor studentsshall take twosubjects related tohis/herDiscipline. Each such subject should of 50% of total credit allotted to this course. Viz; for Three Year UG programmeeach Discipline SpecificMinor shall be of 13 credits and for Four Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 17 credits. Assam University shall notify cluster of subjects fromwhichDisciplineSpecificMinor(DSM)canbe chosen.Tobemorepreciseitis decidedthat DSM-101(3), DSM-201(4),DSM-251(3) andDSM-301(3)= 13creditsshould bethefirst minor subjects incaseof Three Year UG Programme (TYUG) and DSM-151(3) DSM-252(3),DSM-DSM-302 (3) and DSM-351(4) =13 should be second minor subject. For FYUG Programme DSM -401(4) should be first minor subjectand DSM -451(4)should be second minor subject.
- 5. Students securinghighest CGPA (above 6.0) and with noback paper shall beallowed to change his/hercorecourseonceonly,aftercompletionofsecondsemester. However, if a candidated esires to make one of his/her minors to core the nautomatic change in the minor should be done as same subject cannot be opted as both core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.
- 6. 7.5 CGPA should be obtained by a student up to 3rd year for opting Honours with Research Degree in 4th year. However, for only Honours degree there shall notbe any CGPA restriction. But studentswitharrearpapershallnotbe allowedtomoveto4thyearinany case.
- 7. Evaluation of 3and4credit coursesshallbeoutof 100marksandthatfor 2credit course shall be outof 50 marks.
- 8. IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters. Semesterwise change of IDC is not allowed.







- 9. For AEC courses, the reshall not be any internal exam. Total Marks for AEC examination shall be 50 with two hours examination duration.
- 10. SECshallhavetobeoptedfromeitherDSCorDSM.EvaluationmethodforSECforScience streamshallbe50(EndSemester Theory)+30(EndSemPractical/Project/Fieldwork)+20(internal test of which 14for test and 6for attendance). The same for Arts and commerce shall be 50(End SemesterTheory)+20(EndSemester Practical/Project/Fieldwork)+30(internaltestofwhich 20for test and 10 for attendance).
- 11. For EVS (VAC-151) evaluation methods hall be 70 (End Semester exam) + 30 Internal / Assignment. Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
- 12. Evaluation method for VAC -101(with practical) shall be same as that of SEC (with practical)and thatof VAC-101 (Withoutpractical)shallbe sameas VAC-151.
- 13. EVS inVAC-151should be of 100level and EVS included in Natural Science Basket as IDC should be of 200 level.
- 14. Publication/ Presentation of papers out of Research Project/ Dissertation carried out inVIII semester is not mandatory. However, the project shall haveto be presented before Departmental Research Committee and in presence of an external examiner duringend semester examination. Total marks for the project shall be 300 of which 90 shall be internal and 210 is for end semester examination. Outof90marksasinternal,incaseofDissertation/Project,thereshallbethreeprogress reviews and each review shall be of 30marks. Marks obtained by a student in each of the review shallbenotifiedimmediately. Reviewofprogress shallbedonebyconcerned supervisor in presence of Departmental Research Committee.
- 15. Forallothercoursesevaluationmethodshallbeof70marks(forEndSemesterExamination) and 30 marks (for Internal Examination). Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
 - 16. NaturalScienceinIDC, shall not have any practical component.
- 17. ForSubjects with practical's DSC -152, DSC -253,DSC -303,DSC-354 and DSC -404 shall be practical with100marks. Practical examination shallbeheldinpresence of External Examiner.
- 18. ForSubjectswithpractical DSM -251shallbepractical forfirst minor andDSM-351shallbe practicalforsecondminor.Marksforpracticalexamination shallbe100eachandexamination shall behelding behelding behelding behalf behalf
 - 19. ForVAC151(EVS), shall not have any practical component.
- 20. For opting DSC and DSM combination, clustering of subjects shall be as per ANNEXURE-II1. DSC from one cluster and DSM from other cluster is notallowed. DSC, DSM and IDC cannot be the same subject.
- 21. AllDSMcoursesshallbestandaloneandstudentscanselect firstminorsubjectandsecond minorsubjectaccordingto theirchoicekeepingtotalrequirementof17creditforeachminorbutthey cannotchangethe codeofminorpapers.viz;OnestudentofPhysics(Core)mayhaveChemistryas first minor in DSM 101 and Mathematics as second minor in DSM 151. But the other student of Physics(core) mayhaveMathematics asfirstminorinDSM-101andChemistry assecond minorin DSM151.
- 22. ForResearchwithHonoursstudents,DSC-451papershallberesearchmethodologyandcontent ofthiscourseshallbesameacrossthesubjectsandacrossthedisciplines. However,forother students, DSC 451will be a usual 500 level paper.
- 23. AnystudentinterestedtooptforHonourswithResearchshouldhave7.5CGPA up to third year without any arrear.
 - 24. InlieuofMIL, Alternative English may be opted by a student.






THEMANAGEMENT

On1st April1995,the College came under the administrative controloftheNorthCacharAutonomousCouncil,whengreater autonomywasprovidedto the District Council withintheframework of SixthSchedule to the Constitution of India andthe District Council were renamed as "Autonomous Council".
